

# Information clause

According to the General Data Protection Regulation of 27 April 2016, hereinafter referred to as GDPR, we would like to inform you that:

1. Your personal data controller is the University of Gdańsk with its seat in (80-309) Gdańsk at ul. Jana Bażyńskiego 8.
2. The controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer who may be contacted by phone at (58) 523 31 30 or by e-mail at: [iod@ug.edu.pl](mailto:iod@ug.edu.pl). The Data Protection Officer may be contacted in all matters regarding the processing of personal data and exercising the rights connected with the processing.
3. The University of Gdańsk will be processing the following personal data name and surname, name of institution, email address.
4. Your personal data will be processed for the purposes of registration for the Proteomics for Biomedical Research workshop- lectures part. The event will be held on 19-21 of March 2024 and is organised by the International Centre for Cancer Vaccine Science as a part of the CANVAS project.
5. The legal basis for the processing of your personal data is Article 6 of the GDPR.
6. Providing your personal data is necessary to proceed the registration for the Proteomics for Biomedical Research workshop- lectures part, in order to ensure comfortable participation and organisation of the event.
7. Your personal data will be processed on behalf of the data controller by authorised personnel solely for the purposes referred to in point 4.
8. Your personal data will be stored for the period required by the European Commission to ensure durability of the project CANVAS results and audit trail requested in the grant agreement.
9. Your personal data will not be disclosed to third parties with the exception of cases laid down by law (see point 8).
10. Under the terms of the GDPR you have the right to:
  1. access your data,
  2. rectify your data, should it be inaccurate,
  3. erase your data, restrict the processing of it as well as the right to data portability – in cases laid down by law,
  4. object to the processing of your data,
  5. lodge a complaint with a supervisory authority – President of the Personal Data Protection Office, should you consider that the processing of your data infringes the personal data protection regulations.
