- 3. The University of Gdańsk will be processing the following personal data name and surname, name of institution, email address.
- 4. Your personal data will be processed for the purposes of registration for the Proteomics for Biomedical Research workshop- lectures part. The event will be held on 19-21 of March 2024 and is organised by the International Centre for Cancer Vaccine Science as a part of the CANVAS project.
- 5. The legal basis for the processing of your personal data is Article 6 of the GDPR.
- 6. Providing your personal data is necessary to proceed the registration for the Proteomics for Biomedical Research workshop- lectures part, in order to ensure comfortable participation and organisation of the event.
- 7. Your personal data will be processed on behalf of the data controller by authorised personnel solely for the purposes referred to in point 4.
